## The Jamaica Stock Exchange, All Media Services Ltd. Young Investor Series 2016

The Jamaica Stock Exchange Young Investor series is a collaboration between the JSE and All Media Services Ltd. This series provides an opportunity for the top participants in the Stock Market Game for High Schools from the previous year to compete for 12 months (January – December) using a virtual trading platform with JA\$100,000 virtual cash to buy and sell stocks, trading on the JSE. After each quarter, the top three participants will receive cash incentives from the JSE and All Media Services. The overall winner will be determined by the individual with the highest portfolio value on December 16, 2016.

This season's competitors are: Kevani Wright, Lando Graham, Donald Lydner, Donmar Blake, Kaylia Stephenson and Elisabeth Brown; all participated in the 2015 school competition.

After five weeks of trading, Lando Graham leads after his portfolio increased by \$1,409.09 as a result of trades in KW and JBG shares to close the week at \$190,448.40. His portfolio consists of 13,526 JBG shares

In second place is Kaylia Stephenson who was in third place last week. Kaylia did not trade this week but movements in HONBUN and JSE shares saw her portfolio increased by \$7,895.00 to end the week at \$114,532.60 to move into second place. Her portfolio includes 1,100 CAR; 1,200 HONBUN; 1,000 JBG and 400 JSE shares.

Kevani Wright is now in third place after his portfolio declined by \$2,689.03 to end the week with a portfolio value of \$109,076.07. He traded shares in CCC, SIJL and SVL shares. He currently holds shares in JBG 4, 785; SIJL 1,544 units.

Elisabeth Brown is in fourth place. She also saw her portfolio declined by \$6,466.88 this week after trades in NBCJ, CPJ and SGJ to end the week at \$96,873.44. Stocks held are CPJ 4,500; SGJ 2,224 units

Donmar Blake did not trade this week and his cash only portfolio remains at \$99,893.52, as he occupies fifth place.

It is still early in the season but Donald Lydner has some work to do to keep in touch with the leaders. Donald traded BRG, SIJL and SJ shares but his portfolio declined by \$1,271.06 to end the week at \$89,373.04. He holds a portfolio with shares in BRG 750; DG 300; JP 2,000; SJ 900.
