Notes to report

Accounting Policies

a) Basis of preparation

These consolidated financial statements have been prepared in accordance with and comply with International Financial Reporting Standards(IFRS).

b) Property, plant and equipment

Land and buildings are recorded at valuation or deemed cost,less accumulated depreciation for buildings. Other fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

c) Investment properties

Investment properties which are not occupied by the Group, are treated as a long-term investments and carried at fair value, representing open market value determined annually by external valuers in the case of land and by the directors in the case of buildings. Changes in fair values are recorded in the profit and loss account. Investment properties were not revalued in the quarter to 30 June 2008

d) Deferred taxation

Deferred income tax is provided in full, using the liability method on all temporary differences arising between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts in the financial statements. Currently enacted tax rates are used in the determination of deferred income tax.

Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which the temporary differences can be utilised.

e) Earnings per stock unit

Earnings per stock unit is based on the group net profit for the period divided by the average number of stock units in issue during the period.
