Company Profile

Jamaica Public Service Company Limited (JPS) is an integrated electric utility company and the sole distributor of electricity in Jamaica. The Company is engaged in the generation, transmission and distribution of electricity, and also purchases power from five Independent Power Producers.

Japanese-based Marubeni Corporation owns 80 percent of the Company. The Government of Jamaica and a small group of minority shareholders own the remaining shares.

JPS currently has approximately 582,000 customers who are served by a workforce of over 1,600 employees.

The Company owns and operates 28 generating plants, 54 substations, and approximately 14,000 kilometres of distribution and transmission lines.

Along with the provision of electricity, JPS is a key partner in national development. The Company has a vibrant corporate social responsibility portfolio and makes significant contributions in the areas of education, health and sports. The Company also has a strong environmental focus and carries out its operations in an environmentally friendly manner.

The Office of Utilities Regulation (OUR), is the independent regulatory agency with responsibility for the electricity sector.

Statement to Shareholders

Last year was a very challenging one for the Jamaica Public Service Company Ltd (JPS). The Company was affected by significant events that affected our financial performance. The effects of Hurricane Dean on the electrical system and demand, the fire that affected our Rockfort power station and the 2000 Job Evaluation and Compensation Review Exercise, seriously affected our overall operational performance and our success with the energy loss reduction campaign.

Despite the challenges, the Company's 2007 operational performance showed notable improvement over 2006. The improvement was evidenced in the quality of service, measured as System Average Interruption Duration Index (SAIDI) and the System Average Interruption Frequency Index (SAIFI). The availability of our generation power stations also improved significantly. In addition, for the first time in six years, the Company was able to halt the growth in electricity losses.

We are still trying to change the focus of the organization, with regards to the main challenges that we face as a company. The Company has therefore continued to implement initiatives to address the issues of safety, energy losses and customer service, which have remained at the top of our priority list. Also, increases in world oil prices and an all-island blackout in July 2007, forced us to critically analyse, and make an extra effort to improve internal processes.

Hurricane Dean

In August, Jamaica barely missed a direct hit from Category 4 Hurricane Dean. The island did, however, experience gale force winds and pounding rain, which resulted in its

south coast and sections of its interior sustaining extensive damage. The damage to the JPS infrastructure can be summarized as: minimal at Generation facilities, widespread on Transmission lines, extensive on our Distribution system and extensive on our Communications Infrastructure. Following the hurricane, JPS was forced to suspend routine operations for approximately four to five weeks to focus its attention and resources on restoring electricity to customers in the shortest possible time. This meant that a number of routine activities such as field service functions, meter reading and revenue protection activities were suspended as the Company redeployed its resources to the hurricane restoration effort.

The restoration effort following Hurricane Dean resulted in unplanned expenditure for the Company, as well as a significant fall in energy sales during the restoration period. In total, the restoration efforts cost the Company approximately J\$688 million, as seen in the table below, while a combination of loss of revenue (\$410 million) and loss of capital (\$135 million) resulted in an overall impact of \$1.234 billion.

approach and, as a result, the Unions issued a 72-hour strike notice on November 21, 2002. The matter was referred to the Ministry of Labour, where several meetings were held without agreement. As a consequence, the Ministry referred the matter to the Industrial Disputes Tribunal (IDT) for their intervention. After hearings on March 29, 2003, the IDT ruled that: implementation date for the Reclassification Exercise should be January 1, 2001, and the salary

2000 Job Evaluation and Compensation Review Exercise

The Job Evaluation and Compensation Review Exercise goes as far back as November 2000, when the Company and two unions, the National Workers Union (NWU) and the Bustamante Industrial Trade Union (BITU) signed a new Heads of Agreement. The Agreement provided for a Job Evaluation/Reclassification Exercise to be completed by March 2001. However, the exercise was conducted over the period November 2000 to February 2002, under the supervision of an Oversight Committee comprising Union and Company representatives. The Company and the Unions could not agree on the implementation

structure should be consistent with the structure in the 1990/91 exercise.

JPS was unhappy with some aspects of the IDT ruling and challenged the matter in court. The Company appealed first to the Supreme Court and then to the Court of Appeal, but both courts upheld the IDT ruling. The court proceedings ended on March 7, 2007, after which the Company and unions agreed to begin the process of implementing the IDT Award. In April 2007, the Company and the Unions agreed to the reconstitution of the Oversight Committee, which subsequently produced a report in November 2007 indicating the cost of

this exercise for JPS. The unfolding of the 2000 Job Evaluation / Reclassification Exercise (IDT ruling) had a negative financial impact of J\$2.4 billion dollars, as a provision was made during the year pending the finalization of the work of the consultants contracted to do the computations. Also, the delay in resolving this crucial issue had some serious operational consequences, as the Company suffered two industrial actions that affected the service to our customers in 2007.

Fire at Rockfort Power Station

On August 13, 2007, a fire on generating Unit #1 at the Rockfort power station resulted in significant damage to the unit, which affected the Company's reserve margin. In light of the major damage to the unit's turbo charger, cylinder lubrication system, cylinders in the forward side of the engine, instrumentation, overhead crane and electrical equipment, the supplier recommended the installation of two new turbo chargers. Consequently, the unit was unavailable for several months, but the rehabilitation work restored the unit to its original output which had been lost several years before. The unit was returned to service in February 2008, fully restored at a cost of J\$370 million. There was insurance covering this accident.

Financial Performance

Operating revenue was \$54.2 billion in 2007, which represented a \$6.0 billion, or 13%, increase over 2006. This increase was driven primarily by the increase in fuel costs and was partly due to both the annual non-fuel tariff adjustment (implemented in July 2007) and the 5% increase in the average foreign exchange (FX) rate. Energy sales (volumes) increased by 0.3% over 2006.

The cost of sales was \$37.9 billion in 2007, which represented a \$6.4 billion, or 20%, increase over 2006. This increase was driven primarily by the increase in fuel costs which, in turn, was driven by the significant increase in the cost of fuel per barrel; and partly by the 5% increase in the FX rate.

As a result of the two factors mentioned above, the gross profit declined by 2%, or \$392 million, during the year to \$16.3 billion.

Operating expenses were \$9.8 billion in 2007, which represented a \$1.5 billion, or 17%, increase over 2006. This increase was driven primarily by the \$630 million, or 14%, increase in maintenance expenses, and the \$820 million, or 21%, increase in selling, general and administrative (SG&A) expenses. The increase in SG&A expenses was influenced primarily by the \$301 million increase in the provision for doubtful debts and a \$290 million increase in staff costs.

Depreciation and amortisation expenses were \$3.3 billion in 2007, which represented an increase of 15%, or \$421 million, over 2006, mainly as a result of capital expenditure in the last year and the effects of the revaluation of specialized plant and equipment.

Net finance costs were \$2.7 billion in 2007, which represented a 3%, or \$85

million, decline relative to 2006. This improvement in net finance costs was due primarily to the fall in interest costs, which was driven by the refinancing of US\$180 million of the Company's debt stock at improved interest rates.

Other income was \$1.6 billion in 2007, consisting primarily of \$712 million of insurance proceeds relating to a long outstanding claim for generation plant damage, and \$491 million in relation to the Hurricane Ivan award made by the OUR during the year. This award represented the partial recovery of a \$1.4 billion hurricane damage claim filed by the Company. The remaining portion of the claim is in dispute and will be heard by an Appeals Tribunal.

Other expenses were \$3.3 billion in 2007, which consisted primarily of a \$2.4 billion provision for the settlement of the Industrial Disputes Tribunal (IDT) award in relation to the Job Evaluation /Reclassification Exercise; and \$688 million in hurricane restoration costs.

As a result of the factors noted above, the Company recorded a net loss after tax of \$515 million for 2007, which represented a \$2.5 billion decrease compared to the previous year. However, in accordance with the Z-factor provisions provided in the operating licence, the Company has filed for the recovery of the total financial impact of Hurricane Dean. This is on the basis of this amount being an extraordinary cost affecting the Company, which are not covered under any other aspect of the operating licence. This cost, being a legitimate operating cost that could not be avoided, should thus be recovered through tariffs.

Announcement of Sale of Mirant's Shares

On August 9, 2007, Marubeni Caribbean Power Holdings, Inc., a wholly owned subsidiary of Marubeni Corporation of Japan, announced that

it had completed the purchase of equity shares of Mirant Caribbean Holdings (MCH). This followed the announcement by U.S. independent power producer (IPP), Mirant Corporation (Mirant) on July 2006 that it would be initiating auction processes to sell all of its international businesses, which would include its eighty percent (80%) shareholding in JPS. Marubeni was awarded the holdings in a competitive auction process held by Mirant, and signed the definitive sale and purchase agreement with Mirant International Investments on April 18, 2007.

Marubeni has been supplying and constructing power stations, transmission lines and substations for overseas power projects since the 1960s.


Serving Our Communities

The residents of the Old Harbour Bay community in St. Catherine were also big beneficiaries of the opening of a JPS-sponsored Homework Centre, fully equipped with computers and other related equipment. Our involvement in sports continued in 2007, with sponsorship of basketball, football, athletics and netball at both the community and national levels.

We wish to thank all stakeholders - our shareholders, customers, communities and employees - for the roles they played in helping the Company address the challenges and embrace the opportunities that 2007 brought. We remain committed to strengthening the partnerships with the different groups of stakeholders, as JPS continues to play its role in building Jamaica.

Shining Despite the Odds

The Jamaica Public Service Company (JPS) thrives on dynamism. Employees work around the clock in the continuing effort to deliver world-class service. As they work, the complex nature of the Company, combined with the dynamic environment in which it operates, occasionally results in a number of challenges that test the mettle of employees and increase their drive to serve. But, despite the many challenges, the lights continue to shine and the Company continues to play a critical role in the economic development of Jamaica.

Hope Shines Through

In 2007, JPS continued its focus on three core areas: Safety, Customer Service and Loss Reduction. So serious was the Company about the issue of safety that a revolutionary initiative – *The Safety Incentive Programme* - was launched early in 2007. Through this programme, employees were able to earn “live cash” for excellent individual safety performance, as well as the safety performance of their divisions or primary business units. This was an initiative designed to revitalise the collective safety mindset resulting in employees keeping safety in mind at all times, both on and off the job.

For the most part, employees made every effort to achieve the Company’s safety targets but, unfortunately, there were a number of safety incidents that threatened the performance of the team. Consequently, the targets were not achieved and the Company ended the year with disappointing safety results vis-à-vis targets.

But it was not all bad news for safety in 2007. Some units provided the Company with a reason to celebrate. During the year, the Bogue Power Station proudly celebrated 13 years without a lost time accident. This was

a commendable achievement deserving of a celebration. It was therefore appropriate that on March 31, some members of the Board of Directors, the President and CEO, and senior management representatives, joined the Bogue team for a gala event in honour of a job well-done.

Another group of hardworking employees that made notable strides in the area of safety was the Hydros Team. On June 26, 2007, this group of employees assigned to the Company’s hydroelectric plants was vaulted into the spotlight when they marked 376 days without a recordable incident.

With safety experiencing a number of negative blows during the year, these two positive achievements gave the Company distinct hope and the motivation to continue efforts to achieve its goal of a working environment where safety is not just a concept but a way of life.

Making Shining Improvements

2007 was the year of the customer. As the Company continued to build on the improvements of 2006, a number of initiatives were implemented with the objective of transforming customers’ experiences into moments of satisfaction.

A significant initiative was the refurbishing and, in some cases, complete renovation of some customer care offices across the island. This transformed the offices into welcoming, spacious settings where more customers can conduct business. This initiative had two-fold benefits. While customers now enjoy better quality service, employees can also look forward to spending their days in more comfortable environments, conducive to delivering first-class service.

In 2007, the Company also merged the Billing and Mail Services and Call Centre Departments to create a more efficient Customer Care Centre. This facility has been having a positive impact on the quality of service that customers receive, with more seamless operations resulting in a significant reduction in the response time to customers' queries, billing matters and service calls.

The Company continued to add customers' cellular phone numbers and email addresses to its database in order to facilitate more timely communication to customers. This has resulted in fewer customers facing the possibility of service disconnection, as they receive bills by email and text reminders if their accounts become overdue and unpaid.

During the sweltering summer of 2007, JPS customers across the island were given the royal treatment when the Company held a series of Customer Appreciation Events dubbed, "It's Summer...Cool Down With Your Fan". At each event, customers had the opportunity to interact with their customer service representatives and get critical customer service information. They were also entertained, fed, feted and had the opportunity to win fans and other prizes.

On the operations side, JPS continued to invest in the core areas of power generation and delivery. The Company spent over J\$3.2 Billion on capital projects aimed at improving service to customers. One of the key projects implemented during the year was the rehabilitation of one of the generating units at Rockfort Power Station, which resulted in a 10% increase in the output from that unit.

JPS also implemented a protection modernization project, which saw the

changeover from electromechanical to microprocessor relays in an effort to improve the accuracy and reliability of the fault detection mechanisms on the network. In 2007, the ongoing structural integrity programme involved the replacement of over 100 defective poles, as well as other elements of the transmission and distribution systems, thereby significantly improving the reliability of service to customers.

Shining Through Adversity

In 2007, JPS started to see some tangible results of its long difficult fight against electricity theft. Despite the upward trend in world oil prices, which inevitably meant that customers paid more for electricity, through a number of initiatives, JPS managed to significantly slow the growth of electricity theft, thereby reversing the trend of the past five years. Overall, losses for 2007 went up marginally by 0.07% from 22.9% in 2006 to 23.2% in 2007. This compared favourably to an average increase of 1% annually over the past five years.

During the year, the Company achieved notable successes with the discovery of several outstanding cases of theft among large business customers. This was the direct result of a concerted effort to focus more resources on the detection of theft and other anomalies among large customers, even as the Company continued to focus on theft among residential users.

In 2007, JPS made 34 arrests, audited 15,000 accounts, removed over 25,000 throw-ups and recovered approximately 49 GWh or J\$494 million in retroactive and forward billing.

JPS will continue to intensify its efforts to reduce the theft of electricity, as this is one of its major business goals. In the last quarter, the Company introduced an Advanced Metering

Infrastructure (AMI) programme for priority commercial customers. This programme is expected to significantly improve the Company's ability to monitor customer consumption on the national grid on a real time basis, thereby significantly improving JPS' ability to detect non-technical losses. The first phase of the programme is expected to be completed in April 2008, while the second phase will be implemented over the next two years.

Despite its efforts, however, the Company maintains that electricity theft is a matter that requires national attention from all stakeholders – the government, the police, the social welfare groups, community leaders, influential members of the society, and the church. The criminal act of stealing electricity cannot be tolerated, as this has significant implications for all stakeholders.

A Shining Example

There is probably nothing that unifies the Caribbean more than the game of cricket. It is the passion and lifeblood of the people. With the hosting of the Cricket World Cup 2007 in the region, last year was one of the most exciting for Caribbean nationals. Every individual, every business wanted to be in on the action. It was not surprising, therefore, that as sole provider of Jamaica's electricity supply, JPS would play a critical role in adding energy to the Jamaican leg of the greatest showcasing of Caribbean unity.

The Company, which was also a founding member of the Caribbean Business Club (CBC), - an organisation created to harness the economic benefits to be derived from hosting Cricket World Cup 2007 - worked closely with the local organizing committee in preparing for the event. The Company's efforts included taking steps to ensure maintenance of maximum reserve margins for adequate supply, system upgrading and reconfiguration, and installation of

infrastructure at event venues to facilitate reliable power supply during matches. There was also a reduction of planned maintenance outages during the period.

At the end of the spectacular event, the Company's efforts shone through. The country represented itself admirably, and when the annals of history tell there story, it will reveal that JPS played its role well, made Jamaica proud and did its part to ensure that everyone had a memorable Cricket World Cup 2007.

But 2007 wasn't only about cricket. As a responsible corporate citizen, JPS continued to make a difference in the lives of individuals and organisations throughout the year.

The Company's corporate outreach activities ranged from support for the public education programme of the Jamaica AIDS Support for Life (JAS), to an exciting Christmas Treat for the children of St. Wade's Basic School in Old Harbour Bay, St. Catherine. The Company also continued its tradition of sponsoring the PowerServe Award at the Jamaica Manufacturing Association (JMA) Awards ceremony.

As a partner in the efforts to improve health care in Jamaica, JPS provided financial support to the Burn Unit at the University Hospital of the West Indies (UHWI) to assist with its overall programme, which includes reconstructive burn surgery, the training of health professionals in the care of burns and an outreach programme on prevention and first aid.

In 2007 JPS took its series of Science Expos, which is held in association with the Scientific Research Council (SRC) and the Association of Science

Teachers of Jamaica (ASTJ), to another level. Students across Jamaica had a lot to be excited about as, following the regional showdowns, the winners had the opportunity to compete for a grand prize and the title of the National Science Expo Champion. Four little girls from Denham Town Primary took home that trophy for their impressive exhibit "Emergency Housing." The Company also recognised the achievements of the nation's young scientists. In 2007, Dr. Seymour Webster received the JPS/SRC award for Young Scientist of the Year for his research on the guinea-hen weed as a cure for cancer.

The sponsorship of the Kettering Scholarship also received a boost in 2007. With the Company's support, four students went off to Kettering University in Flint, Michigan to participate in the institution's five-week summer programme for Academically Interested Minors. At the end of the programme the students outdid themselves when all four placed in the top 15, from a group of students from 40 states across the US, and the Caribbean. For the second consecutive year, Jamaica took home the prize for placing first and for his outstanding performance, Travis Townsend of Ardenne High School

was awarded a full scholarship to pursue a Bachelors Degree in September 2008 at Kettering University. The other students placed 2nd, 6th and 11th, qualifying for half scholarships to the institution in 2008.

In 2007, JPS continued its support of education through the donation of over J\$8 million to tertiary institutions including: the University of the West Indies (UWI), The University of Technology (UTECH) and the Northern Caribbean University (NCU). These donations will assist in upgrading facilities as well as the implementation of a number of financial and technical programmes to benefit students.

In response to requests for information from JPS by secondary-level students to fulfill the requirements of their School Based Assessment (SBA) programmes, in late 2007, the Company produced a SBA Handbook designed specifically to answer frequently asked questions from this group. The Company also went a step further and opened a Resource Centre, which provides access to publications and facilitates internet-based research on topics related to the electric utility industry.

In 2007, the Company also donated funds to United Way, played a major support role in the Jamaica Trade and Invest Expo, participated in the annual charity fundraisers - Sigma Run and the Cancer Relay for Life, and initiated a partnership with the island's disabled community.

Empowering Others To Shine

Even before 2007, the name JPS had already become synonymous with sports in Jamaica. Name any popular sport in the island - whether it be basketball, football, athletics or netball - and it is highly likely that JPS has had or is currently involved in that sport in some way. Throughout 2007, the Company deepened its relationship

with these sporting events through increased sponsorships and more active partnerships. These included: regional Netball Leagues, gold sponsorship of the Negril Fun Run, Eastern Champs, Eastern Cross Country Run, Gibson Relays, JPS-sponsored Football Leagues and the All-Island Jamaica Basketball League (JABA).

The Company also cemented its relationship with a number of communities in very practical ways. As JPS continued its initiative to partner with the communities that are located close to its power stations, the Old Harbour Bay community was a big beneficiary in 2007. Early in the year, the community received a Homework Centre courtesy of JPS. This facility was outfitted with twenty computers, audiovisual equipment, air conditioning units, chairs and workstations. It is expected to serve as a location where students within the community can do their assignments or carry out internet-based research, while also providing an opportunity for the adults in the community to become familiar with the computer and its attendant technology.

The Old Harbour Bay community was also singled out for the Company's corporate Labour Day project, which saw employees transforming the Community Centre and its environs into an attractive facility where residents can once again host meetings and community events.

Following the passage of Hurricane Dean, which ravaged sections of the island in August 2007, the Old Harbour Bay Community also received critical assistance from JPS through donations of generators, food packages, and the creation of a temporary ironing facility. This initiative was also extended to include the community of Portland Cottage in Clarendon.

JPS continued its computer donation programme in schools, with a total of 150 computers being given away in 2007. The Company was also instrumental in saving the Saunders Basic School in St. Thomas from going out of operation through donation of critical construction material that was needed to erect a kitchen in fulfillment of the requirements of the Parish Council. In addition, JPS also participated in a number of Reading Fairs across the island, made donations to infirmaries in Falmouth and St. Ann, presented packages to the Lister Mair Gilby School for the Deaf, and held a host of community and stakeholder meetings in parishes across the island.

Shining On The Inside

It was in August 2007 that the dynamic nature of the Company was once again on full display when Mirant sold its 80% stake in JPS to Marubeni Caribbean Power Holdings Inc. (MCPH), a subsidiary of Marubeni of Japan. This change generated some anxiety among employees, while at the same time eliciting great expectations. However, despite the air of uncertainty that hung over the Company for a while, a number of positive activities took place during the year.

JPS employees continued to prove their ability to rise above adversity, and shine through even the most difficult circumstances. The 2007 Hurricane Season provided another opportunity for team members, who again showed their commitment to ensuring that power is restored to customers as soon as possible after a disaster.

Hurricane Dean caused extensive damage to sections of JPS' transmission and distribution network. Coming out of the experiences of the past, the Company was prepared and had all the mechanics in place to take on the challenges of this natural phenomenon. Restoration therefore began within hours after the hurricane had passed, and progressed speedily and smoothly, except in some communities that presented significant challenges. In some areas, the work crews had to contend not only with badly damaged power delivery infrastructure, but were also faced with accessibility issues and difficult terrain. This resulted in some customers being without electricity for an extended period of time. However, despite the challenges that the Company faced, power supply was restored to all communities across the island within a month.

A number of initiatives were implemented to recognize the outstanding work of employees in different areas of the Company. At the inaugural Peer-to-Peer Plant Environmental, Health and Safety Audit Awards in October, the Rockfort Power Station was awarded the top prize for Outstanding Achievements in Safety and Environmental Standards. This followed an audit of all power stations over a four-month period, from April to June 2007. The audit included an examination of all aspects of power station operations, ranging from the maintenance of sanitary facilities, to the upkeep of generators. The hydroelectric stations were awarded the Most Improved Station category, while twenty-nine (29) auditors drawn from across the Generation Division were given Certificates of Participation.

The Peer-to-Peer Plant Environmental, Health and Safety Audit Awards is intended to become a quarterly event on the JPS Calendar.

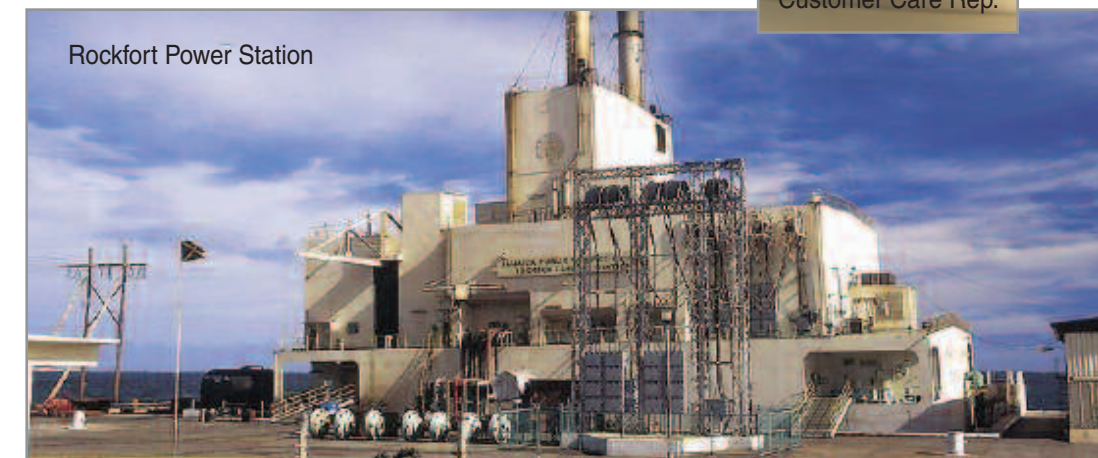

At the end of the year, a number of shining stars in the Customer Care Department were recognised for excellent performance in their various areas. These individuals exhibited a great deal of initiative and high productivity levels in all their work activities throughout the year.

The commitment displayed by team members in 2007, along with the operational improvements and the strong partnerships between the Company and the wider community, have paved the way for JPS to continue playing a pivotal role in the future of Jamaica.
