



Jamaica Stock Exchange's Monthly Regulatory Report May 2017

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Overview

This is the Jamaica Stock Exchange's (JSE) May 2017 Monthly Regulatory Report. The report gives a synopsis of the following regulatory activities:

1. Member-dealers' reporting,
2. Listed companies' submissions,
3. Market surveillance and compliance activities,
4. Regulatory breaches and enforcement actions.

Member-Dealers' Reporting

In accordance with JSE Rule 209 (A) member-dealers were required to file Monthly Reports for the period ended April 30, 2017 by May 31, 2017. For the reporting period, thirteen (13) Monthly Reports were due and submitted on time.

Based on JSE Rule 209 (B) member-dealers were required to file Quarterly Reports for the period ended April 30, 2017 by May 31, 2017. For the reporting period, one (1) Quarterly Report was due and submitted on time.

Under JSE Rule 209 (C) member-dealers with financial year ended February 28, 2017 were required to file their Audited Reports by May 31, 2017. No Audited Reports were due, hence no filings were received.

The aggregate compliance rate for member-dealers' filing of their Monthly, Quarterly and Audited Reports for the month ended May 31, 2017 was 100%. For the 2016 comparative period member-dealers' aggregate compliance rate was also 92%.

The RMOD wishes to advise that as a result of its processing of matters pertaining to JSE's Trade Quotations, information on member-dealers' financial condition as at April 30, 2017 is not represented in this publication.

Listed Companies Submissions

During the month of May 2017 Listed Companies were required to file Unaudited Reports for the period ended March 31, 2017 by May 15, 2017. Listed Companies with year ended March 31, 2017 that selected the 60-days filing option were required to file Audited Statements by May 30, 2017. Listed Companies with year ended February 28, 2017 that selected a 90-days filing option were required to file their Audited Statements by May 29, 2017. Additionally, Listed Companies with year ended January 31, 2017 were required to file Annual Reports by May 31, 2017. The filing statistics are represented in Table 1 below:
